Per section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank-Act, Conflict Minerals are defined as: Tantalum, Tin, Tungsten, Gold or their derivatives sourced from the Democratic Republic of Congo or its adjoining countries Angola, Zambia, Tanzania, Burundi, Rwanda, Uganda, South Sudan, Central African Republic or Congo.

SCHUNK GmbH & Co. KG does not engage in the direct import or use of so-called "conflict minerals". SCHUNK is a production capital equipment supplier, that manufactures toolholding, workholding and gripping systems for your production environment.

We confirm that we do not knowingly use the above mentioned conflict minerals in the production of our products. Furthermore, to the best of our knowledge and based on information obtained from our suppliers, we are not aware that our raw material or component suppliers use conflict minerals.
